Ramadan: reflection, remembrance... and patience

Once more, we are most fortunate to be able to see another Ramadan. Here is our chance to improve ourselves, including our patience, which many of us lack.

Prophet Job was always very grateful to Allah, remembering him all the time.

"Truly we found him patient. How excellent a slave! Verily, he was ever oft-returning in repentance to us" (Quran 38:44)

Iblis wanted to tempt Job. So he tried, but Job would not let these whisperings disturb him.

Annoyed, Iblis went to Allah, saying that Job was only worshipping Allah because he wished to keep his wealth. Allah knew that Job was a sincere believer but to prove Job's sincerity, he gave Iblis permission to do as he will.

Iblis began wrecking Job's wealth, until nothing remained of it. He came in the form of an old man to Job and said:

"Your wealth is gone - if your lord Allah could have prevented this, then why did he not do so?"

Job replied that it hadn't been so, and prostrated upon the ground.

Iblis was displeased but he was willing to try again. This he did, a great many times, taking his children and then his health.

However, Job was still patient, even when close friends and relatives deserted him. Only his wife stayed to comfort him. Iblis came to her and reminded her of the good life she had lead She cried out to Job:

"Why don't you call upon Allah to remove this suffering?"

Job saw that she had lost her faith in Allah and asked her to leave the house. He took an oath that if he ever regained health, she would receive 100 strokes. So Job called upon Allah, not to complain, but to seek his mercy:

"Verily, distress has seized me, and you and the most merciful of all those who show mercy. So we answered his call, and we removed the distress that was on him, and we restored his family to him and the like thereof along with them - as a mercy from ourselves and a reminder for all who worship us" (Quran 21:83-84) And so Allah restored his bounties to Job - even his wife came back to him. And once more, Job was grateful for the favours Allah had bestowed upon him.

Allah's mercy lets us see another Ramadan, for indeed, the fate of a person's soul lies only with him.

Take this opportunity before it is too late. It may be the last one!





The Quran was revealed during the month of Ramadan, on the night of power. Indeed, the Quran mentions this in Surah-Qadr:

"Verily we revealed the Quran on the night of Qadr" (Quran 97:1)

This one night has the power of more than 1000 months and is a most blessed night, because he who misses this opportunity has missed a very worthwhile opportunity indeed. This is, after all, the month in which the gates "So patiently persevere: for verily the promise of Allah is true: nor let those shake thy firmness, who have no certainty of faith." (Surah 30 Al-Rum, verse 60)

of Paradise are wide open and those of Hell are closed, and the devils are chained.

Those who do take this opportunity will have all their previous sins wiped away.

It is recommended to make long night prayers on this night. In many hadeeth it is recorded that 'whoever stood for the sake of Allah on the night of Qadr, all his/her previous sins will be forgiven'.

Allah says in the Quran:

"The night of decree is better than a thousand months" (Quran 97:2) It is also important to make supplication during this night. It is reported in a hadith that Aisha asked the Messenger of Allah:

"Oh Messenger of Allah! If I knew which night was the night of Qadr, what should I say?"

The Messenger of Allah told her to say:

"Oh Allah, you are forgiving and you love to forgive, so forgive me"

This night is in the last ten days of Ramadan.

Allah says in the Quran:

"The angels and the spirits descend therein by permission of their Lord for every matter.

Peace it is until the emergence of dawn" (Quran 97:4,5)

The Prophet would, on the last ten days of Ramadan, stay away more from his wives in order to have time to worship, and spend the whole night awake in prayer.

He would worship more during these days.
